NOVEMBER 19, 2019 SESSION SUMMARY

The session met for the first time with the Rev. Mark Eldred. serving as Moderator. As part of his initial report, some details of the his Installation Service on January 5. 2010, 2:00 pm. were provided. Marty Hageman, Treasurer, reported that in October expenses of \$14,500 were addressed with income of \$10,500. Compilation of the Church budget for 2020 is in progress. Pledges for the upcoming year are still being accepted.

The Mission Committee represented by Bill Bowman, Chairperson, brought a proposed overture regarding divestment from fossil fuel industry investment and encouragement of investment in securities of companies which focus on renewable and/or energy efficiency. By a majority vote, the Session forwarded the overture to Mid-KY Presbytery. (A copy of the overture may be obtained from Bill Bowman.) The Mission Committee also brought a request to utilize \$5,000 from the Mission Bequest Fund to support the construction of a proposed new chapel at Cedar Ridge Camp. The request was approved. Building and Grounds Committee will address concerns identified in a recent visit by a Code Enforcement representative who was inspecting exterior matters only.

Christian Education services are consumed with preparation for the children's cantata and the service project of the adolescents. The Committee hopes to dedicate funds to permit six teens to accompany teens from Highland Presbyterian Church on a spring break tour of key sites of the Civil Rights movement.

Contributions and volunteers are still welcome and needed to shine during Bardstown Road Aglow on Saturday, Dec. 7th. Regarding the Christmas season, Advent dinners will occur on Wednesdays, 12/11 and 12/18. The Worship and Music Committee is working on executing the traditional Cantata, a Coterie event, and special worship events during the Christmas week.

The Session encourages our members and friends to participate and draw spiritual renewal from the many opportunities to express and live our faith that are offered through BRPC.

U OF L WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

You are invited to the U of L Women's Basketball Game on **Sunday, Jan. 12,** at 2 p.m. at the Yum Center. Free tickets will be available in the church office after Dec. 18. The Lady Cards will play Wake Forest on this date. Providing tickets for a women's game has become an annual event and a group of 25 tickets will be purchased.

In January, Cedar Ridge will be the site of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery's retreat for the clergy of our Presbytery. This event is designed to offer clergy an opportunity for rest, relaxation, renewal, and connecting with fellow ministers.

Efforts are moving forward to make the Calvin Chapel a reality. Groundbreaking is planned in the spring on the lower level, which will provide a much-needed weather shelter area. Volunteers are busy in fundraising efforts. Calvin Church pledged around \$550, 000 for the project which is projected to cost over \$750, 000.

The balance is being sought through grants as well as donations from churches and individuals. These may be one-time donations or pledges to be paid over three years. The BRP Mission Committee has voted to send \$5000 now from the Mission Tithe Bequest Tithe Fund, with Possible additional donations over three years.
