Summer Sampler Tours Return: Stained Glass Windows.

Tours of our Member Congregation buildings are returning this July! Join HCM on 2 Sundays this summer for educational and visual tours of stained glass windows at 3 of our member congregations.

Sunday, July 9, 2-4 pm

Highland Baptist Church, 1101 Cherokee Road. "Cloud of Witnesses" windows installed in 1972, designed and created by Robert Markert, display figural Biblical and historical faith leaders.

Sunday, July 23, 2-4 pm at these 2 locations: St. Paul United Methodist Church, 2000 Douglass Blvd. These windows, created by the Willet Stained Glass Company of Philadelphia, were installed in 1964 and tell the Bible Stories and the formation of the Methodist Church.

Chapel at the HCC (originally **Christ Evangelical** now used by **Unity of Louisville**), 1228 E. Breckinridge St. Original windows from the chapel construction of 1902. Learn about the history of stained glass and how it was incorporated into religious structures. Guided meditation times will be available as well.

EV CHARGING STATION

The typical house in Louisville uses about 6,000 to 12,000 kilowatt hours of electricity in a calendar year. Our Electric Vehicle (EV) charging station has been very popular, and we've used about 20,000 Kwh in the one year since it was installed. Thanks to a vote of the BRP Session in 2022, we made this station available to the general public at no charge. Thanks also to Mid-Kentucky Presbytery, who underwrote the cost of the station for BRP and several other congregations in the Louisville area. We're doing our part to make clean EV transportation more affordable.
