The church pictorial directory is nearing completion under the oversight of the Congregational Life Committee. Good response is reported to the upcoming Restaurant Review night. Worship with Deer Park Baptist Church is scheduled for June 30. Any checks marked as Fifth Sunday offering will be forwarded by BRPC.

Highlands Community Ministries

Highlands Community Ministries has been hosting its **3rd annual Summer Sampler Tour**—an exciting opportunity to experience the many flavors of worship in the Highlands. You still have two opportunities to join in for a free and fun way to sample interfaith services in the safety and support of a like-minded group. One half hour before the earlier service, tour attendees board a van at the Highlands Community Campus (HCC), home of HCM, 1228 E. Breckinridge St. @ Barret Ave., for an early service at one of the participating congregations. The group then returns to the HCC for coffee, donuts, and discussion, then leaves again for a later service that same morning. Attendees also have the option of meeting the group at the congregation building if that better meets their schedule.

BRP members are able to participate in the early visits and still attend the 11:00 A.M. service at our church.

On **July 14**, the group will board the bus at HCM at 7:30 A.M. to attend the 8:00 service at St. Brigid Catholic Church (then visit the 10:15 service at Highland United Methodist, with a concert and lunch following). On July 28, the group will attend the 10:15 A.M. service at Christ Evangelical United Church of Christ (no second service following).

Our congregation is participating in **Highlands Community Ministries' Summer Food Drive**. The Dare to Care food supplies get depleted during the summer due to higher demand, which creates shortages in the local food pantries by the time school starts.

HCM Back to School Supplies Collection - Highlands Community Ministries is again asking our help in providing school supplies for area children. The goal for our church is **30 BACKPACKS**, one third of the 90 that HCM hopes to collect. HABITAT NEWS

Presbyterian churches are getting together again this year (that makes over 20 years!) to build another Habitat house! The building will start July 18-20 for the Raise the Roof process, and BRP members are invited to work on **Saturday, July 20.** By the end of the day that Saturday, the exterior walls will have plywood, there will be plywood on the roof, and all the interior stud walls will be complete.
