

Dear Siblings in Christ,

This is the day the Lord has made and I continue to rejoice and be glad that you have called me to be the Pastor of Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church.

I so look forward to getting to know all of you and to sharing in what God has in store for us here on Bardstown Road, Louisville. Starting back in 1888 women, and then men, have raised tens of millions of dollars for worthwhile mission projects. OCTOBER 15, 2019 SESSION SUMMARY

At Stated Meeting on October 15, 2019, Session members received and reviewed the final Moderator's report submitted by The Rev. Mary Nebelsick. The Rev. Nebelsick cited "the willingness to be vulnerable" as a major factor in the resiliency of BRPC. She continued with the observation that "God's mission of peace and love will only be fulfilled in fits and starts, by human beings who are fallible, generous, contrary, and selfless." October 22 will be her final day of worship leadership with The Rev. Mark Eldred preaching on October 27.

The membership total this month is 81. Due to financial assistance from the Brabandt Foundation as well as sustained levels of giving, the total income for the period was \$42,000. This compares with expenses for the period at \$22,000. The Session processed at length concerns raised by Buildings and Grounds Committee for building maintenance and security due to high usage.

The Christian Education Committee has planned a Halloween zoo trip in addition to collecting items for homeless. Supportive visits are continuing to congregants who are home bound or in care facilities.

Mission and Service is promoting the November Thank Offering through the display case near the Fellowship Hall. Project Warm Blitz is planned for November 9.

As a final gift to the Session and congregation The Rev. Nebelsick provided a draft of Administrative Policies and Procedures, a culmination of months of work, to Session. She notes that Allen Purnell is reviewing the Safe Church Policy. When the Session is satisfied that the entire document is satisfactorily reviewed, a meeting to present the Policies and Procedures to the Congregation will be called.

An Administrative Committee is forming to address coordination among the multiple activities presently occurring in or under the auspices of BRPC as well as effective means to communicate Christ's work with and through us.

The Personnel Committee conducted an exit interview with The Rev. Nebelsick and is preparing to assist The Rev. Eldred in his new ministry with this "new church."

BARDSTOWN ROAD AGLOW - Dec. 7




PROGRESSIVE DINNER - December 14
