

### REFUGEES FROM AFGHANISTAN

Mission Committee members heard a presentation from Mary Ellen Harned, a Board member at Kentucky Refugee Ministries, during October. KRM is expecting about 200 Afghan refugees in the next couple of months (and Catholic Charities will take another 150). There has been much in the news lately about the thousands of refugees coming from Afghanistan, and Mary Ellen pointed out three ways that BRP members can help:

- Stress ball or fidget spinners


The goal is to fill 60 boxes.
