SESSION HIGHLIGHTS SEPTEMBER 17

The Session met on September 17 and reviewed minutes of the previous Session meeting and the Called Congregation meeting.

In her Moderator's Report, in addition to detailing her activities in worship leadership and parish visitation, the Rev. Nebelsick reviewed efforts to provide the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery with copies of Session minutes since 2017 as well as a copy of the updated Administrative Manual. The Membership rolls remained stable at 81 members in the last month. By the Treasurer's report the church's operating budget had receipts in August of \$8,320 with expenses of \$13,970. Year to date the income is \$137,390. with expenses of \$139,170 leaving a surplus of \$1770.00.

Neighborfest will occur on Saturday, September 28 in its 11th year as a cooperative endeavor.

A farewell reception for The Rev. Mary Nebelsick is planned on October 20. The congregation is welcome.

The Rev. Mark Eldred will be in the pulpit on October 27.

MID-KENTUCKY PRESBYTERY

At the September 2019 meeting of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery, nine ministers were honored for a total of 295 years of ordination. Ministers are celebrated at five -year intervals on the anniversaries of their ordination.

Since its May 2019 meeting, Mid-Kentucky Presbytery has:

- Supervised the ordination of two ministers
- Approved the honorable retirements of two ministers
- Approved membership transfers of four ministers from other presbyteries
- Approved membership transfer of one minister to another presbytery

Since February 2019, Mid-Kentucky Presbytery has:

Guided 17 churches through a transitional process, to discern their next steps, such as: to call a new pastor, to call a transitional pastor, to use temporary pulpit supply, to share resources and personnel in partnership with another congregation, or to consider other options.



For the past three years, Rev. Mark Eldred has served as the Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian, Old Stone Church, Cleveland where his ministry responsibilities were pastoral care, mission, evangelism/community engagement, deacons, among many others. Prior to his first call in Cleveland and right out of seminary, Mark held a non-ordained position of Interim Director of Adult Education and Worship Coordinator at Fourth Presbyterian Church, Chicago.

Rev. Mark's ministry and mission passions are wide. To name a few, music and liturgy, addiction and mental health, homelessness, access to education, ecumenical and interfaith dialogue, utilizing our gifts and talents to better serve God, contextual faith conversations such as gender, race, LGBTQIAP+, privilege, incarcerated and formerly incarcerated peoples.

Mark received his Master of Divinity degree in 2015 from McCormick Theological Seminary, Chicago, and a Bachelor of Arts in English with honors from Northeastern Illinois University, Chicago, in 2012. Prior to seminary, Mark was a professional singer in the Chicago area, and a long-time member of Fourth Presbyterian Church Choir and the Chicago Symphony Orchestra Chorus.

Rev. Eldred will be preaching on October 27.
