#### HIGHLIGHTS SEPT14 2022 SESSION MEETING

A celebration which included sweets was held before the meeting's business to honor Jennie Guelda for serving on the Session for 2 terms (6 years) and the Pastor Nominating Committee, and Carol Brees who recently retired from her career as an OBGYN doctor.

Rev. Eldred mentioned how he noticed some members experiencing fatigue due to life changes. He will pray on this matter.

A request was made to receive the monthly Treasurer's Reports earlier before the Session Meetings for adequate time to review the information.

The use of the building by AA, NA and Home School was discussed regarding needing agreements for better understanding of how and when our spaces are used. Clare Lewis will investigate how other churches use covenant agreements.

Rev. Eldred requested that he not have to make decisions regarding the building use relationships and ministries. This responsibility is best handled by the Building and Grounds Committee with the Church Administrator, Johanna Fears, acting as the facilitator.

The Congregational Life Committee is considering a holiday progressive dinner with the progressive part being only heavy appetizers.

The Faith and Justice Table on October 1<sup>st</sup> at the Farmer's Market will promote voter registration and provide information opposing Constitutional Amendment #2, which would give no right to abortions or government funding. A motion was approved by the Session to support protective reproductive rights for women as per the PCUSA advocacy.

Carol Brees will do a Minute for Mission to contact our congressmen by letter to support the Afghan Resettlement Adjustment Act and Bread for the World legislation.

Maintaining the security and care of the church grounds due to the recent presence of unhoused people is a concern. Guidance on dealing with loitering is needed to determine the level of investment to help the homeless and being a good neighbor.

The proposed church logo was reviewed again with the sweeping heart and cross design preferred. Clare Lewis will show the logo on letterhead and other media at the next meeting. The design will be shared with the congregation in a future newsletter.

The Personnel Committee recommended that Johanna Fears's job title be changed to Church Administrator due to her increased church responsibilities.

The 2020 and 2021 Session Meeting Minutes will be reviewed at the November Mid-Kentucky Presbytery Meeting at South Frankfort P.C.

The 2023 salaries for all staff and pastor were recommended by the Personnel Committee to be increased by 3%. The pastor's change to Terms of Call will be done at a future Congregational Meeting.

The job description for the Treasurer is being prepared to clearly identify the responsibilities.

Keith Clements reviewed the preparations for Neighborfest involving Deer Park Baptist Church, Deer Park Neighborhood Association, and our church.

A joint service with Deer Park Baptist Church is planned for the third Sunday of Advent.

# Country Living- September 19, 2022 Presbytery Meeting by Jerry Van Marter, Stated Clerk

I knew it was going to be a special day when I walked into the fellowship hall of Ebenezer Presbyterian Church near Greensburg and was guided to the "Foraging Table." The legendary hospitality of "the country church" in Greensburg was on full display as a lavish array of fresh fruit, veggies, cheese, deli meats and other munchies stretched out before me.

It has been many years since the twin churches of Ebenezer ("the country church") and Greensburg ("the town church") hosted Mid-Kentucky Presbytery and it was clear both congregations were eager to demonstrate their hospitality, history and current witness in Green County.

The day began with fellowship and worship at Ebenezer, then moved to Greensburg for the business part of the presbytery meeting. More than 70 presbyters attended – more than half in person at the two churches in the southeast corner of the presbytery and the rest on Zoom. Worship was led by musicians from Ebenezer and Glasgow Presbyterian Church. Rev. Jim Murphy (Bethel First, Campbellsville) preached and an offering of nearly \$1,000 was received to help with flood relief in Eastern Kentucky through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

On the business side of things, the presbytery:

- Dismissed the administrative commission which oversaw the closing of Calvin Presbyterian Church, which held its last worship service in mid-June.
- Dismissed the administrative commission which oversaw the conversion of South Fork Presbyterian Church to an independent congregation and the sale of South Fork's building to the congregation.
- Welcomed two new members into the presbytery: the Rev. Aimee Moiso, the new associate director of the Louis-ville Institute on the campus of Louisville Seminary; and the Rev. Nolan Huizenga, the new bridge transitional pastor at Highland Presbyterian Church. Nolan and Aimee come to us from the Presbytery of Middle Tennessee.
- Honored 14 ministers on the anniversaries of their ordination (5-year increments). Ranging from 10 years to 45 years, the "ordiversary" honorees have combined for 360 years of service to Jesus Christ and the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).
- Elected a slate of new officers and commission/committee members for service to the presbytery beginning in January 2023. Among those elected were 2023 Moderator Perry Chang (Ruling Elder-Crescent Hill) and 2023 Vice-Moderator Rev. Christine Coy Fohr, pastor of Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church.
- Received the 2023 presbytery budget for a first reading, with final action scheduled at the November presbytery
  meeting and approved a 6% cost-of-living increase for General Presbyter John Odom, commensurate with COLA increases already approved for other presbytery staff members.
- Tabled until the November meeting a plan to create a fund to provide grants to MKP member clergy, presbytery employees and employees of member congregations and their families "for medical travel for medically necessary care not available within 150 miles of their homes and not covered by their health insurance."

  The next stated meeting of the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky is Saturday, November 12, 2022 at South Frankfort Presbyterian Church.
