Mid-Kentucky Presbytery Call for Prayer and Action

The Louisville Area Chapter of the <u>National Black</u> <u>Presbyterian Caucus (NBPC)</u>and our local Beloved Community initiative join with Mid-Kentucky Presbytery to encourage all 50 congregations of Mid-Kentucky Presbytery to join hands and hearts in a two-part call to action.

Join August 25 – October 3, 2020 at noon daily---40 Days of Prayer

Mid Kentucky Presbytery's congregations, leaders, and individual members are asked to pause daily at noon for 8 minutes and 46 seconds during the 40 Days of Prayer which begin on August 25 and end on October 3, 2020. The 8 minutes and 46 seconds is the length of time George Floyd endured and finally died under the knee of a Minneapolis police officer. Forty days is a biblically significant number that regularly precedes God's saving activity. You are encouraged to grow your prayer life through daily noontime talks with God. You are asked to lift up individual and corporate concerns along with prayers seeking courage to dismantle structural racism and wisdom for life in a Covid-19 world. Imagine the uplift of over 6,000 Mid-Kentucky Presbyterian voices raised simultaneously to God in prayer.

Join October 4, 2020 at noon

-A Witness for Justice

Congregations and members are invited to become a visible presence in your neighborhood. For 8 minutes and 46 seconds, Mid-Kentucky Presbyterians will be encouraged to gather in front of your particular church buildings, gather in church parking lots, congregate on church lawns, perhaps with signs or banners as Mid-Kentucky Presbytery witnesses – through prayer and presence—our collective commitment to dismantle structural racism. In advance of the Witness for Justice, a downloadable Mid-Kentucky Presbytery resource will be shared with all pastors and clerks of session. By witnessing—separately, yet together—we act as one church, one presbytery, one people speaking out for the day when God's justice will roll down like waters, and God's righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

MISSION COMMITTEE CALENDAR YEAR 2019

The Committee engages with groups outside of the church to support their missions with funds and volunteers. We spent \$5,000 from the Mission Bequest Fund to support Cedar Ridge's Chapel project. We also established a relationship with Ladder Ministries of Uganda and sent them funds for their trees and seedlings project. Since we could not travel to Buckhorn for a summer mission trip, we sent funds in lieu of a trip. We helped BRP youth with scholarships to Cedar Ridge for summer camp, and we helped build a Presbyterian Habitat house. We collected food and presents for Christmas Baskets for HCM families, and also food for Easter Baskets. We continued to support HCM financially and also Shared Mission Support through the PC(USA).

MISSION COMMITTEE 2020 ACTIVITIES

The Committee has met only two times in person, with the rest of the meetings coming via email. Still, we continued our financial support of HCM and Shared Mission Support through the PC(USA). We also encouraged members to give to the four special offerings of the church. Among other activities, we were successful in having the PC(USA) approve our application to remain an Earth Care Congregation, and we provided bus tickets to those in need who came to the office door. Since the Buckhorn mission trip was cancelled for the second year in a row, we sent money in lieu of our visit. We also helped 5 BRP youth go to summer camp at Cedar Ridge through our scholarship funds.

CONGREGATIONAL LIFE CALENDAR YEAR 2019

2019 was a busy year for Congregational Life committee. Our activities covered two areas:

<u>Congregational care</u> which included regular contacts with homebound individuals and families, monthly birthday cards to all congregants, delivery of meals to those having surgery or other situations where food is welcomed, and transportation to medical appointments as needed.

Congregational Fellowship which included overseeing quarterly after church dinners, Lenten and Advent dinners, organizing groups to attend sporting events especially the UL women's basketball games. Working with other committees we assisted with outreach efforts of Bardstown Road Aglow, providing our now famous Tomato Basil soup. As in years past our committee assisted with Neighbor Fest, a fall festival sponsored by BRP, Deer Park Baptist (across the street), and the local neighborhood association.

ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE REPORT CALENDAR YEAR 2019

The Administration Committee was organized in 12/2019 to assist in coordinating among church committees and programs. Additionally, a second goal focused on identifying and implementing strategy(ies) s for use of current technologies in communicating the Gospel and BRPC's ministries. The need for these functions in the church organization had been identified years earlier, but the roles had been carried by the Pastor and a few individuals until the Committee was activated by Clerk of Session.

The committee felt that the first responsibility to address was to evaluate the possibly replace the church website. Additionally, in light of the significant impact after theft of electronics from the church office, the Committee proposed that a manual of all electronics and related software utilized in church programing should be compiled.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE REPORT CALENDAR YEAR 2019

Personnel Committee provided reminders consistently regarding the importance and necessity for criminal records checks for Church staff and volunteers working with the nursery, youth and children programs. There were transitions during this year to some paid nursery time when Jennie Guelda, faithful volunteer, asked for backup support. Personnel Committee also participated in the review and preparation of materials for the Manual of Operations.

Personnel consulted with Pastoral Nominating Committee and Finance Committee on transition from interim pastor to permanent pastor. Personnel Committee completed an exit interview with The Rev. Mary Nebelsick regarding her experience and unique contributions during her ministry. Personnel met with The Rev. Mark Eldred, to clarify his role as Head of Staff as well as to explore his initial goals for ministry.

Personnel consulted with Buildings and Grounds Committee in assuring uninterrupted custodial services when transitions were necessitated due to health issues of staff. Personnel participated with Christian Education on the transition of Coordinator for Youth and Children Services. Personnel reviewed job description and selection process, in coordination with Christian Education Committee, for Nursery staff (part-time, hourly worker)

Personnel met and acted on cost of living increases for 2020 budget. Committee also prepared budget items for all paid positions. At the end of the calendar year, the budget consists of one fulltime staff person (Pastor) and four part-time paid staff (Administrative Assistant, Coordinator of Youth and Children, Custodial, Nursery Worker).

Visit the website <u>midkentuckypresbytery.com</u> to learn about the upcoming meeting, to see how the Presbytery is assisting and other Presbyterian churches are operating in the Covid -19 times, and to connect with fellow Presbyterians.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS August 18, 2020

At an in-person meeting on August 18, 2020, in which social distancing conditions were observed, the Session members were joined by three of the nominees for the Class of 2023. The meeting offered the opportunity for sharing of personal histories and leadership skills of participants. The nominees were able to participate in discussion.

Three significant actions were taken during this meeting.

The date of the congregational meeting was changed from August 23, 2020 to September 13, 2020. The meeting will be conducted during the worship hour with access in person and live streaming. Further details for voting will be provided in mailing to the membership.

The Session endorsed the initiative of the Mid-Kentucky Presbytery that an 8 minute 46 second moment of silence and prayer for forty days (August 25, 2020 – October 3, 2020) at noon in memory of the death of George Floyd. The Session requests participation in a time of silence by membership even if the exact time frame is unavailable.

The two week Solidarity Stand-ins for Justice and Peace are extended to September 14 2020, September 28, 2020, October 12, 2020, and October 25, 2020. 5:00 P.M. - 6:00 P.M. on church property.

The July 2020 Treasurer's Report noted that the church's operating budget had receipts of \$9,390.00 with expenses of \$14,910.00. Year to date the income is \$145,350 with expenses of \$129,080 leaving a surplus of \$16,265. The monthly deficit is attributed to the loss of income through loose offerings and Love Gifts. Due to utility savings and canceled programs there will be some savings in the 2020 budget.

The Rev. Mark Eldred stressed the importance of active work on part of Committees during the social distancing period. Committees will be re-organizing when the new class is elected to the Session. Congregation members and participants are requested to consider prayerfully the skills and time each has to offer during this unprecedented time.

Thanks to many wonderful folks, HCM has received many generous donations since the beginning of the

pandemic....but the need continues for food, toiletries, etc.! If you want to help, you can:

HCM's annual fundraiser, *Empty Bowls*, will look different this year.

As you may be aware, HCM's annual fall fundraiser, Empty Bowls, will not be happening as usual this year due to Covid-19. However we have a new plan in place to do some fundraising, but mainly want to keep the event spirit alive by sending support out to the people that help make this event possible every year: the local restaurants who donate soup and artists who donate pottery bowls... two groups that are hurting disproportionately during the economic crisis resulting from the pandemic.

We are asking you, our Member Congregations, to help us spread the word of this year's event. Normally you would do that and more including helping organize the event, sending over volunteers, and soliciting donations for a silent auction theme basket. This year we are only asking that you lend as much advertising as possible through your communications with your Congregations.

The event date is Thursday, Oct. 8. For six weeks prior, we will be advertising to the public via several different platforms (email marketing, social media, radio, and your newsletters and communications) to donate to HCM and in return, donors at a certain level will be eligible for a drawing of hand-crafted pottery bowls (attractive groupings of bowls donated from previous years) and local restaurant gift cards. Plus, 10% of all donations will go towards <u>APRON</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, a local non-profit that lends financial assistance to employees of Louisville's independent restaurant community. We will also encourage the public to patronize the artists and restaurants.

Cedar Ridge Camp was a busy scene this summer, in spite of the pandemic. In June, children and youth were able to attend two weeks of Monday-Friday day camp-masked and socially distancing. In July, approximately 40 campers and staff experienced 21 days at an overnight Quarantine Camp, where they were able to be normal campers—sans masks—following two rounds of Covid-19 testing. August saw three more weeks of day camp opportunities.

Work has continued on the early stages of construction of the new **chapel** following the July 1 groundbreaking! If you have not yet donated, some funding is still needed to fully fund the project.

The annual fundraiser for Cedar Ridge, *Autumn Under the Cedars*, will be virtual this year in early October, with some new elements. 
