Greetings Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church

Happy New Year to all of you! We had quite the wild path through our Christmas Season with a storm that provided challenges. I think of the entire context of the baby Jesus story in our scripture that was entrenched in challenge after challenge for all involved. His parents had to be on the run almost immediately after his birth for fear of their and the newborn's life. His whole life was a bit of a challenge; both to live it, and for all who followed his Way. I wonder what it would be like for us to remember this when we confront our own challenges as a church, as a community - that we aren't alone in challenges placed in our path as a community of faith. In fact, it is more the norm than the exception.

The first week of January is the final days of the 12-days of Christmas season in to Epiphany, January 6th. We will celebrate Epiphany on Sunday, January 8. Epiphany is Greek for 'to reveal' - it is the day that the baby Jesus was revealed to the world. I know we have had a long couple of years with our own challenges through the pandemic, but I have been enjoying some of these 'aha' moments, or little epiphanies. We are a community that likes to eat, and I have enjoyed being back around table with all of you! I have had 'aha' moments with the more consistent return of our choir, being reminded how important music is to the culture of our church and community. I have had 'aha' moments when groups of folks have come together to do the 'tasks' of the church - cleaning the kitchen as a group, greening the church, welcoming guests in to our building during the visiting flute choir concert and the Coffee Stop program, and the wonderful conversations and fellowship of our progressive party. These are just a few.

I hope you will join us for worship on January 1 and 8 as I have a special sermon series that involves the concept of epiphany through self-revelation - seeking to stay a tuned to these 'aha moments in our lives. We have much to look forward to in 2023, and I am blessed to be your pastor as we walk together in to a new year!

Highlights of December Session Meeting 2022

- Rev. Eldred said he would get out of the building to do more visits in 2023 and will send his Moderator's Report to the Session tomorrow.
- Communion dates are set for Christmas Eve December 24 and January 8 (Epiphany) 2023.
- The Presentation Budget Report for 2023 and the Preliminary Budget Review and Information that included commentary prepared by Doug Rapp were reviewed.
- The 2023 Annual Budget cannot be finalized for approval until all committee budget sheets are submitted. Upon approval by the Session the 2023 Budget will be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation tentatively scheduled for February 19, 2023 and will be included in the 2023 Annual Report.
- The 2023 staff salary increases of 5% were approved at the October Session meeting.
- The Personnel Committee will set a process for the determination of future staff salary increases based on the criteria of performance and COLA percentage.
- The Session approved changing the floor of the investment policy from \$550,000 to \$750,000 with a distribution rate of 15% based on the three-year average balance. It was requested to show the investment balance on the statements.
- The electrical service costs are high for the use of the electrical vehicle charging stations and a QR Code sign will be installed for users to make a contribution with their iphones.
- A Called Meeting of the Session may be required to finalize the budget requests and committee expenses before the next Stated Session Meeting.
- Donations totaling \$116.00 for Highland Community Ministries was received from the Coterie CoffeeStop Concert.
- An energy audit will be done in January to examine ways to cut costs and maintain our Green Church Certification. The team will include LLester Gamble, Bill Bowman, Clare Lewis, Doug Rapp, and Rev. Mark Eldred. They will be using a checklist to follow provided by PCUSA.
- The AA Group's request to use Fellowship Hall for their Friday night meetings will be reviewed at the January Session meeting. Prior to that there will be a meeting with the group to set a precedent of space limitations and people to contact.
- Maddie Vanamburgh's confirmation project will be a town hall meeting of LGBTQ+ issues sometime after church.
- Prayers were expressed for Jeanie's surgery on December 23 and Paul Johnson's surgery on December 21
- A \$200 donation from our Peacemaking Offering was given to support Changing Guns into Plowshares sponsored by Douglass Blvd. Christian Church.
- The Bread for the World Farm Bill is coming before congress regarding food related issues in Third World Countries. Support will be requested in January and February.

- Letters thanking those who pledged were sent by the Stewardship Committee.
- The next Stand-in-Solidarity will be January 9, 2023
