SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

During his Moderator's Report, Rev. Eldred thanked everyone for helping with all the events during Holy Week. We used "muscle memory" to get things done as they were done before the pandemic.

Keith Clements presented Shirley Shaw's suggestion to have our church make a donation to Cedar Ridge Camp for a memorial stone for the chapel walk in honor of Grad and Florence Shoemaker. Grad had tirelessly worked at the camp building and repairing the cabins.

A motion was made and approved allocating \$200 from the Mission Bequest for an 8" x 8" paving brick for the memorial walk honoring Grad and Florence Shoemaker.

The Membership Report acknowledged the death of Bill East who died on March 30, 2022 and was buried on a hill in St. Michael's Cemetery in Louisville. Several members attended the grave site service.

Marty Hageman reported that \$75,000 has been designated for the Building and Grounds Maintenance Reserve Fund and \$5,000 was donated to Living Waters for the World in honor of Jeff Wagner.

The water/sewage and gas utilities are exceeding the budgeted costs to date due to mechanical leaks and higher utility rates.

LLester Gamble stated that our building is getting more use in post covid times and a work-day is planned once inhouse tasks can be determined.

The Alcoholics Anonymous Group is getting bigger and need a larger space. They moved downstairs during Covid but need to return to Fellowship Hall. They do not need to use the sound system or the kitchen. Rev. Eldred will meet with the group to have clear expectations about their use of Fellowship Hall.

A motion was made approving that the AA Group can use Fellowship Hall on Friday night once repairs are done to the restrooms which is anticipated to be by May 6, 2022 with guidance from Rev. Eldred.

Doug and Molly Rapp will be hosting the Derby Party on Saturday May 7 at 5:00 P.M. They will provide the entrée and guests will bring side dishes and appetizers.

The roping will remain between the alternate pews for safe distance seating and LLester will be contacting people to usher.

Jennie Guelda said the Adult Education Class and the One Room Sunday School are continuing and activity books with social justice topics will be used for the youth. Bill Bowman will be taking a group on July 7 to 10 to Southwestern Kentucky near Madisonville to help Presbyterian Disaster Assistance clean up following the December Alicia Bloos is setting up a meal train schedule for providing doughnuts and preparing coffee for the Coffee Hour.

Bill Bowman mentioned that KY Interfaith Power and Light is co-sponsoring with other groups and congregations to raise funds to install rooftop solar panels on schools and government buildings.

Clare Lewis said that our church will start putting our bulletins (only the service information) on our website on a weekly basis. She will be looking at some alternative designs for our church logo to consider for new platforms.

Becky Shafer was thanked for organizing our Easter Breakfast in Cherokee Park.

New bibles are in the pews and book plates will be made to honor the donors.

LLester was pleased with how our participants presented themselves at our Stand-in-Solidarity gatherings promoting social justice and not political issues.

A work session is scheduled on May 14 to prepare the soil and install plants for the pollinator garden. Beargrass Creek Alliance will assist with the planting.
