Greetings Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church,

With shouts of "Back to School" already behind us, here we are heading in to fall of 2021. A year ago, I had some hopes that we would be having different conversations than we are. If anything, some of the conversations of church, mission, and ministry have increased in complexity when trying to consider how to serve the entire community. We head in to fall with some new ways of gathering, some new considerations, and hopefully some caution and patience on all parts.

Once again this year, I invite you to join with me in the second annual 'Read-Through-The-Bible-In-A-Year' starting September 1 of 2021 and ending August 31, 2022. Why is this important? Intention. God's Word for each of us and for all of us is the central reason that we gather as a community. The characters, stories, and truths ask each of us to consider and reconsider their relevance in our time, in the here and now. If you are interested in joining in this venture, please reach out to me so that I can begin setting up some virtual or in-person gatherings once per month that we might share in this venture in community.

After church on Sundays in October, I will be leading a four-week Adult Education study of the Book of Job read parallel with Ta-Nehisi Coates' 2015 best seller *Between the World and Me* (Spiegel & Grau Publishers, New York). The gathering will center on biblical topics of mortality, the body, connection, race, identity, spirituality, and the current state of our faith conversations in every day life. Coates writes a letter to his adolescent son, an epistle like journey of his personal observations of what it is to be a black man and black body in today's world. Adult Education will continue through May, gathering to share in other narratives and conversations to be announced.

All-Saints Weekend, Halloween Weekend, we will share in not only our All Church Retreat at Camp Cedar Ridge on Saturday, October 30, but Stewardship Sunday on October 31. October will be Stewardship 2022 kick off month. Let's all begin to be thinking about how we can best offer service to God and the church community through our time, talents, and treasures. If you ever would like to have a conversation with me about ideas that you have, please reach out. One thing that I will ask everyone to consider in forming new ideas of mission and ministry is how will that idea make its way to a mission or ministry that has the potential to thrive and succeed? What steps are necessary to make a vision a logistical and functional reality? We will be spending some time at All Church Retreat on these very conversations. At our retreat, we will also share in a segment regarding how we will continue to care for one another as a church community.

Dear Siblings in Christ, thank you for your patience, continued love, strong support, and most especially for your kind words and your presence at church and with one another during these past many months. We continue to be church in the world, in the ways that God is calling us to proceed. I give thanks today for Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church and for each of you!

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE AUGUST 2021 SESSION MEETING

For the Moderator's Report, Rev. Eldred said he had met with each of the staff to consider ways to re-energize with small groups in the church.

Since we have not heard back from Westwood P.C. about gathering together again, Keith Clements will contact Don Seeger, their moderator, about ways for a continuing our relationship.

There was no written Treasurer's report for July, but there was discussion of restarting the Kroger Community Rewards by acquiring credit points using Kroger cards.

Rev. Eldred has contacted other ministers along Bardstown Road regarding homeless people and how they are coping with them. Our "little library" was recently vandalized.

Due to so many requests for the use of our building, Rev. Eldred suggested a process by which church leaders could review and approve these requests so he can spend his time ministering in other areas.

The high school kids requested a study curriculum on women's issues this fall. The Sunday School leaders will include Rev. Eldred, Molly Rapp, Clare Lewis and, possibly, Allen Purnell.

Our sponsored mission couple, Jeremy and Luta Garbat-Welch are in need of a car and a house to rent while they are waiting for reassignment. They have been invited to do a Minute for Mission at a Sunday service in September.

The communion dates were approved through 2022. Christmas Eve was added for communion and there will be pastoral visits for home communion. Because the Delta virus is surging, wearing masks during the service is requested as per Gov. Beshear's mask mandate.

Covenant Community Church is planning to meet for services again on August 15. There will be a meeting with them to review their requirements.

Bill Bowman has offered to chair the Stewardship Committee with Clare Lewis as vice-chair. Stewardship Sunday will be October 31.

The Personnel Committee will be meeting to review our Sexual Misconduct and Safe Church policies, employee benefits and setting up staff reviews.

Ketih Clements reported for Neighborfest on September 18. Deer Park Neighborhood Association will be involved and our Metro Councilwoman, Cassie Chambers Armstrong, has been contacted to promote our event.

The Personnel Committee will be meeting to review our Sexual Misconduct and Safe Church policies, employee benefits and setting up staff reviews.

Keith Clements reported for Neighborfest on September 18. Deer Park Neighborhood Association will be involved and our Metro Councilwoman, Cassie Chambers Armstrong, has been contacted to promote our event.

Rev. Eldred promised that the Session Retreat on August 20 and 21 "will not be boring" planning for 5 and 10 years ahead.

Rev. Eldred and Sarah Hageman will be attending the Bellarmine Faith Fair on August 29 from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. to promote our church and Young Adult program.

Our church will share a Justice Table at the Saturday Farmer's Market. We will need several volunteers to rotate for this shared relationship of telling people who we are. Offering swag bags is being considered.



# NAMI Louisville's annual Virtual and In-Person Walk –October 1 through 8, and Saturday, October 9

Do you know what NAMI is? It is the National Alliance on Mental Illness, "the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness" (from the nami.org website). Many cities have a NAMI chapter which focuses on Mental Health needs of a specific city and communities. Pastor Mark and Gillian are individual family members of NAMI Louisville. If this is a topic that is of interest to you, feel free to check out the NAMI Louisville's website or to reach out to Pastor Mark. This year, he will be making plans to attend the virtual walk between October 1 and 8, which is participation on the individual level. Maybe in future years our church would consider joining in the In-Person walk which benefits the national NAMI organization, NAMI Louisville, and conversations about mental health out in the world of all of our daily lives? NAMI walks are the organization's largest fundraiser of the year and bring thousands upon thousands of folks out to walk for a cause - that of breaking the stigma of mental health!
