This past summer we held a town hall style meeting to dialogue and ask questions of Rev. Robert Owens, long time Lead Organizer with CLOUT, and their newest member of the support team John Aden, Associate Organizer. Rev. I was blessed to be sent to the DART Justice Ministry Conference this past July. As so many organizations do, they speak in acronyms. D.A.R.T. stands for Direct Action and Research Training Center, which is located in Miami, Florida and is the larger umbrella to more than thirty organizations like CLOUT – Louisville.


It would be impossible for me to share with you all of the knowledge that I gleaned from the conference. The take away is a very solid overview and comfort level with the work that both DART and CLOUT does. They have a specific way of getting from point A to point B that they feel works and is effective. The conference was mostly about how all of the pieces of the DART year puzzle fit together and work together.

There is one point of this justice ministry that I want to lift up today. One of the primary goals of the work of DART in justice ministry is in building and sustaining relationships through common interests. The way that we find the interests of our community starts with a house meeting. On the front end, I want to say that my very hope for this first year of CLOUT, for us as a community, is this intentional gathering process where we share in a common conversation but with the hope of our individual voices and stories being heard by one another. This gathering for the adults very much parallels the work that Sarah and I will be sharing with the youth and children.

I can't think of a better time than now to re invest in our relationships, to rebuild our connections, and to be in a safe and nurturing space that allows us all to feel heard and loved. I look forward to seeing many of you this church year at adult education, CLOUT house meetings and gatherings, youth and children's Sunday classes, and other ways that we will gather and share in God!

# HIGHLIGHTS OF THE AUGUST 2023 SESSION MEETING

Rev. Eldred will be on vacation from August 15 through September 5<sup>th</sup>. He will be conducting the memorial service at BRP for Becky Shafer on August 26<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 p.m. A reception will follow in Fellowship Hall. A private burial at Cave Hill cemetery will be immediately after the reception.

Marty Hageman reviewed both the June and July Treasurer's reports. The session approved the motion put forth by the Finance committee to increase the amount of our investment principal that is not available for operating budget expenditures. Blessed with some legacy gifts, the committee felt it was important to protect the funds use, stay prepared for economic uncertainties, and continue to honor those who made the undesignated gifts.

Molly Rapp reported that the Personnel committee and Building and Grounds committee have begun conducting interviews for the Custodian position. A revised job description has been written and shared with the session. Many ongoing improvement projects are taking place this month.

The Home School will be using our building on Tuesdays this year.

Rev. Eldred reported that the Adult Education Class will meet this Fall on Thursday evenings from 6:00p.m. to 7:15p.m. The dates are September 14<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, October 12<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>, November 9<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. Youth and Children's programs will alternate between Confirmation, Individual faith projects, and Bible based Sunday School. September 10<sup>th</sup> will be the kick-off for Confirmation and September 17<sup>th</sup> will be the kick-off for Bible based Sunday School. Dates for Confirmation class are October 1<sup>st</sup>, November 5<sup>th</sup>, and December 3<sup>rd</sup>. Dates for Bible based Sunday School are October 15<sup>th</sup>, November 19<sup>th</sup>, and December 17<sup>th</sup>.

Jennie Guelda and Paul Johnson have been chosen to be Team Leaders for CLOUT. Alicia Bloos has been asked by Presbytery to be Vice-Moderator this year.

Neighborfest will be held on September 16<sup>th</sup>. Bardstown Road Aglow will be held on December 2<sup>nd</sup>.

The next communion will be held on September 3<sup>rd</sup>. The session voted to pursue the request to host World Day of Prayer, sponsored by Church Women United. This will take place in March 2024.

The session agreed to hold their monthly meetings for 2023-2024 on the third Tuesday of the month. The next session meeting will be held on September 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### **BATTERIES AND...**

We will be collecting household batteries again this summer, to deliver them to the Hazardous Waste facility in the fall. Please collect your batteries--from flashlights, hearing aids, remote controls, toys, and other household gadgets--and bring them into the church in the next couple of months. There is a container in the rear of the sanctuary for your convenience.

We've also discovered that **mercury thermometers** can be recycled at the same facility, so add those thermometers to the things you'd like to recycle, and we'll get them taken care of. Just like batteries, thermometers should not be thrown in the trash due to the heavy metals they contain.

## BUILDING AND GROUNDS- BEHIND THE SCENES

You may not have realized it but there has been a lot going on behind the scenes over the last month. Below is a list of some of the things completed and some of the things we are still working on:

- Steam cleaned the sanctuary carpet and each of the pew cushions. Also had carpet stretched to take out some of the creases that could cause a hazard when walking.
- Pastor's bathroom was updated. Walls were repaired and painted along with new lighting fixture.
- The flat roof over the office and over the stairwell on opposite side of building were repaired. Leaks were causing damage on the ceilings and walls. Soon we will begin doing those repairs.
- A Contract was signed and working with TK Elevators to do annual maintenance on our elevator and to do the annual required state inspection. Lubrication of the lift should reduce noise.
- New air conditioners were put in the following areas:
   one in the Clubroom, two in Fellowship Hall, two on
   floor 2 ½ which is where Home School meets, One repaired on second floor classroom. These will compliment the three new mini-split air conditioners previously installed in the kitchen, office, and pastor's study.
- New plastic round tables and cart were ordered and in place in the Fellowship Hall. These replaced the damaged wood round tables.
- New white board hung in the office for messaging and other needs.
- Several window blinds were replaced.
- Worked with a contractor and installed new light fixtures in the hallway on the first, second, third floors and over-steps leading to basement. Lighting fixtures in other areas were re-wired and converted to LED bulbs. Close to a hundred bulbs were installed. This eliminates ballasts.
- A dumpster was order and was completed filled with old furniture, broken items, etc. and another one is planned soon to continue the clean up.
- Shrubs were trimmed and flowers planted below the sign in front of the church.
- Second floor classroom and hallway was cleaned and waxed and a partial floating floor was put in one of the classrooms as well as ceiling tile replaced.
- Committee is also interviewing for a new custodian with some handyman skills.

There is still a significant list of things we want to get done but we are making progress. We want to thank those that have helped us in many of these areas. Bill Bowman, Jonathan Baize, Paul Johnson, Clare Lewis, Cheri Baize, Molly Rapp, and Llester Gamble. We appreciate the stewardship of helping maintain God's house. We will continue to make it more inviting to all who come. Doug Rapp


#### KENTUCKIANA HOMESCHOOL
